It details the hospital's initiative put in place to greatly improve its sepsis pass rate, which is the percentage of patients diagnosed with sepsis who receive timely and appropriate care according to established sepsis management guidelines.

The project was led by Kimberly DeLoney, RN, Infection Preventionist, with oversight and contributions from Rudra Beharrysingh, MD, James Lawrence, MD, Lauren Darsey, RN, FNP-C, and Michelle Benton, RN.

The poster presentation explores Morgan Medical Center's step-by-step process for early recognition and treatment of sepsis, spotlighting methods, tools, and data collection and analysis. The project resulted in the 2024 Patient Safety and Quality Award, earning third place in the Critical Access Hospital category.

The award gives patients in the area assurance that Morgan Medical Center continues to be a convenient and trusted source for optimum health care.

"While we greatly appreciate GHA's honor, Morgan Medical Center is privileged to share what's worked for us in effort to help enhance best practices among our fellow critical access hospitals," Castillo explains.
