The projects will impact many of our hospital campuses and physician offices. Projects include:

- Books for pediatric patients from birth to 5 years old to promote literacy.
- Adaptive fishing gear and supervised outings for patients with neurological conditions to help them return to normal life.
- Journals to help postpartum mothers express feelings and document milestones.
- Blood pressure cuffs for low-income, under- or uninsured patients diagnosed with hypertension.
- Signage to help connect patients facing domestic abuse with resources and support.
